

Fire Extinguisher Training

OSHA Regulations:

1910.157(g)(1) Where the employer has provided portable fire extinguishers for employee use in the workplace, the employer shall also provide an educational program to familiarize employees with the general principles of fire extinguisher use and the hazards involved with incipient stage fire fighting.

1910.157(g)(2) The employer shall provide the education required in paragraph (g)(1) of this section upon initial employment and at least annually thereafter.

* Customers with outdoor facilities suited for live fire training sessions must call their local fire department to determine their requirements for an open fire. If permits are required, the customer must obtain them. Customers with outdoor facilities not suited for live fire training can opt for the indoor educational session which include a video presentation and hands on training with an inactive fire extinguisher on a simulated fire.
